- General CRP sign up will start March 14th through April 15th. We will offer workshops, and advertise in the local papers. It will be much the same as the last sign-up except for a few changes for the Pollinator Habitat.
- Rental rates might change?
- Working on completing 15 WHIP applications rankings by February 25th.

JEFF SEAGO'S REPORT (Soil Conservationist)

- We have five applications for EQIP.
- · Received maps from the county assessor which showed Forest Reserve enrollment.
- We have 11 WHIP contracts.

NRCS REPORT-Wayne Shafer District Conservationist

- George is continuing to work on cost share estimates and preliminary computer designs.
- CRP-Tyler has 2010 CRP contracts completed.
- Badger Creek Watershed. Staff is completing design and estimates for large tile outlet terrace project above M-2. CREP wetland bid letting last December. Bid was awarded to AGE Construction. Work will begin as soon as the weather permits. This will be only the second CREP wetland south of Interstate 80.
- DNR- funding for Watershed Planning Grant. Discuss coordinator staffing.
- **EQIP-** Jeff has completed the estimates for the first cutoff. Second round cutoff for applications is 2/25. All WHIP funds must be obligated by 4/1.
- CSP-Jeff has completed the signup. Interest from private forestland owners this year. Will schedule field visits in March and April. All contracts must be obligated by 5/16.
- IJOBS-Project is completed. Truro is considering Phase II of the project. Shafer will complete the report. Jason will write a grant for Phase 2.
- CIG-presentation of preliminary public survey by Validus. Board need to discuss how to proceed.
- Staff-Tyler's Private Lands Biologist Cooperative agreement is up for renewal. The district must discuss and make a decision today whether to continue. This is a 2 year agreement.
